# **ARRL Field Day 2011**





The MARC Field Day Planning Committee is working diligently to ensure that we have a successful event this year – but we need your help. Among our goals is to ensure that every interested MARC member has an opportunity to operate and participate in the event to the greatest extent possible. Please take a moment to fill out a brief survey that will help us better understand why Field Day is important to you, what activities you would like to see at Field Day and when you are available to operate.

If you previously took the survey, you do not need to do it again. Thank you and we look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at Field Day.

The ARRL Field Day for 2011 will be held on **June 25-26**, **2011**. It is always held on the fourth full weekend in June beginning at 1800 UTC Saturday and ending at 2100 UTC Sunday. Field Day is always the biggest on-air activity of the year in the US and Canada. It is a great opportunity to practice emergency communications capabilities and demonstrate those capabilities to the general public. Since it is not technically a cutthroat contest, Field Day is a great opportunity for inexperienced contesters to learn how to operate in a low-keyed, low stress environment.

For 2011 MARC will operate its own station at the Lower Providence Fire Company, located at Ridge Pike and Mount Kirk Avenue, Eagleville (see the maps at <a href="http://www.marc-radio.org/fieldday.htm">http://www.marc-radio.org/fieldday.htm</a>).

Here is an update from the Field Day Committee:

- The most important thing is that we are hosting field day this year – even if it's only a limited effort, we'll grow it in the years to come
- We'll rely on power from the facility not worry about generators
- Based on the amount of equipment available, we still need to determine what class of station we will have
- We'll use this event to clean out the storage locker so that we can eliminate that ongoing expense
- Food will be purchased and brought in there will be no cooking – that will be easier and our cook (Yak) is not available for this event
- We expect to have participation from the boy scouts
   the scope of this still needs to be worked out
- We've invited a couple of public officials and we're waiting to see who responds (State Senator Andrew Dinniman and State Representative Chris Ross)
- The goals of field day are:
  - o Have fun
  - Participate in a contest and do the best we can, but it's not the primary purpose
  - Conduct an exercise in emergency communications
  - Provide an opportunity for new/non-hams to operate/participate – have a GOTA station

# **MARC Board Meeting Minutes**

**MARC Board Meeting** 

April 12, 2011

Board members present: Steve WA2EAJ, Miguel KC3HMG, Bob N3JIZ, Jim W3DCL, Dennis K3DS, Doug NE3U, Dieter K3DK, and Gerry W3GER

In the absence of **President Steve KD3WK** (detained on business in Boston) **Vice-President Steve WA2EAJ** called the meeting **to order** at 7:10 PM.

Minutes of the February 8 Board Meeting were approved.

In the absence of **Treasurer Lou WX3I**, it was stated that the **bank balance** is around \$12,000.

The feature of the next General Meeting will be the annual auction--

- Talk it up, get stuff to sell
- Dennis K3DS (who will serve as the auctioneer) will provide vouchers to facilitate payment

The **May Meeting on May 17** will feature **Howard Sherer AE3T** presenting EME, meteor scatter, and the like.

Discussion of compensation for presenters--

- The board approved a \$50 honorarium for Howard Sherer AE3T due to the fact that he will incur travel expenses from Allentown, PA.
  - (Editor's Note: AE3T respectfully declined the honorarium)
- Steve WA2EAJ will take AE3T to dinner (not paid for by MARC)
- Should we provide free MARC membership for presenters?
- Decide on a case-by-case basis for future presenters

#### Legal matters--

- We have a lawyer assisting us *pro bono*.
- Verified that we ARE a Pennsylvania Not for Profit Corporation
- There is no sign of our continuing to have 501(c)(4) [tax-exempt] status
- We're obtaining a copy of our Articles of Incorporation (\$45) and the 'corporate book' will be made current
- Taxes are a function of income
- We still have our ARRL-affiliated status
- We've lost our Special Service Club status by not filing requisite annual papers
  - Steve (KD3WK) has completed the online application to reinstate this designation and we hope it will be easily recovered
  - ARRL still gives us stuff to give away at the hamfest


Here is Howard's biography from his QRZ.com page. "I was first licensed in 1964 as WN2RBG in upstate New York and upgraded to general during my 1 year novice term. I am currently active on HF and VHF weak signal operation. I prefer CW on the HF bands and enjoy chasing DX as well as rag chewing. On VHF I am interested in studying the wide range of propagation modes available, and have become active on 2M meteor scatter, and EME using the WSJT modes. On 2M EME, my station is limited and I run 500 watts to a single 12-element K1FO 2.5WL yagi. I have been very pleased with my results working the large EME stations around the world."

Howard and I grew up as hams in Albany, NY at the same time but attended different schools. You will find both of us on the same extended family tree and we are distant relatives. This looks like it will be a very interesting and informative program so let's try to have a big turnout for this month's general meeting.

YOU **MUST** REGISTER IN ADVANCE FOR THE VE TEST SESSION! For more information or to register, please contact **Bob Lees W3ZQN** at rilees@aol.com. If you do not register in advance for the VE Test Session, you may find no one there to test you. Applicants should arrive no later than 9:15 AM. All applicants MUST PRESENT EITHER A PHOTO ID OR TWO OTHER FORMS OF POSITIVE IDENTIFICATION. The test fee is \$15, preferably by a CHECK MADE PAYABLE TO ARRL/VEC. Those wishing to pay cash may do so but please bring EXACT CHANGE. MARC members can take one test per year for free!

Applicants already holding an amateur license must BRING THE ORIGINAL OF THAT LICENSE PLUS A PHOTOCOPY OF IT. Applicants holding a Certificate of Successful Completion (CSCE) for any examination element must BRING THE ORIGINAL CSCE PLUS A PHOTOCOPY OF IT. Applicants wishing to upgrade a Technician License held before 1987 must BRING THE ORIGINAL PLUS A PHOTOCOPY OF THE DOCUMENT VERIFYING THE DATE OF THE ORIGINAL LICENSE.

Please be aware of the following Mid-Atlantic Amateur Radio Club policies concerning VE Test Session:

- We stop issuing exams at 11 AM. After that you will not be permitted to begin a new test.
- If you fail an element, we do not allow a retake of that element using another test version. However, if you are prepared to take the test for the next higher element, you may take that test. Passing a higher element without passing the lower one does not entitle you to the license associated with that higher element.

## **Postage Price Increase Now in Effect**

On Sunday, April 17, the US Postal Service increased the price to mail certain items within the US and abroad. While the cost to mail a 1 ounce piece of first class mail within the US stays at 44 cents, the cost of mailing a postcard increased one penny, from 28 cents to 29 cents.

Remember this when mailing out your domestic QSL cards as postcards.

# Ofcom to Issue Special Temporary Call Signs for Royal Wedding

If you are a prefix hunter -- or you just get caught up in the pageantry that a Royal Wedding can bring -- then take note: Ofcom, at the request of the Radio Society of Great Britain (RSGB), will issue special temporary call signs that British amateurs may use from April 29 through May 9, 2011, commemorating the marriage of HRH Prince William of Wales and Miss Catherine Middleton. Amateurs in the United Kingdom who choose to apply for these special call signs will be using GR, MR and 2R prefixes during this time to commemorate the wedding.
